I've always believed that challenges set us up for tremendous growth. I've seen it in my own life, and I've seen it in our work here at One World Surgery. While the past two years have certainly been difficult, never in our history have we seen such progress. Here in Honduras, we have built up the capacity of our local staff and are serving more patients than ever. We've expanded services to include comprehensive primary care, opened an on-site microbiology lab, and established a fellowship program for Honduran surgeons in partnership with the University of Minnesota Department of Orthopedics, Summit Orthopedics, and Dell Medical School.

Our statistics prove this growth: patient infection and complication rates were under 1%, and we maximized the use of all three of our operating rooms. Our local team and medical mission volunteers served 57% more patients compared to 2019, which was our previous record-breaking year.

We are truly building a legacy of hope and healing for our patients and their families. Thank you for partnering with us to transform lives and communities throughout Honduras and the world.




