Medical Missions

What to Expect

Medical Missions are typically one week long (Saturday to Saturday) with up to 60 volunteers per team. Volunteers stay at our onsite visitor centers in Honduras and the Dominican Republic, and work alongside our local team to provide surgical, primary, dental, and follow-up care for patients year-round.

Surgical roles: Surgeons, Anesthesiologists, Pre-op Nurses, PACU Nurses, Surgical Techs, OR Circulators, Physical Therapists, other medical staff, and general volunteers.

Primary care roles: Physicians, Nurse Practitioners, Physician Assistants, Pharmacists, Nurses, Medical Assistants, other medical staff, and general volunteers.



Honduras

One World Surgery funds and operates the Holy Family Surgery Center in Honduras, which has 3 operating rooms, 6 overnight bays, and dental, primary care, and optometry clinics. The center is located one hour outside of the capital, Tegucigalpa.



Dominican Republic

The Saint Mother Teresa Medical Center is located in the Dominican Republic between Santo Domingo and Punta Cana and offers primary care, surgical care, and optometry services both to local Dominicans and Haitian immigrants. Primary care services are also offered in the local communities, called bateys.

→ Application

Visit our website to view our trip calendar and apply for a Medical Mission. Applications are accepted year-round.

→ Cost

Program fee structure:

- First volunteer: \$1,000
- Immediate family member, regardless of age: \$500 (includes spouses, adult children, and parents only)

Program fee includes housing, meals, ground transportation, and emergency medical insurance. Program fees help cover a portion of patient care costs. Volunteers are responsible for all other travel and flight costs.

→ Scholarships

One World Surgery offers limited need-based scholarship opportunities. Some employers and associations offer medical mission scholarships for eligible volunteers.
